Any equipment or resource that is required must not be available from statutory agencies such as social services or the NHS. Previous grants include touch screen computers, specialist car seats, power wheelchairs, trampolines, sensory toys, tricycles and quadricycles.

Examples of equipment provided include electric wheelchairs, walking aids, trikes, educational toys, communication aids, adapted car seats and lifting and posturepaedic sleep equipment.

- **Disabled Facilities Grant**

A local council grant to help towards the cost of adapting a home to enable the person to continue to live there. Work can include widening doors and installing ramps, providing or improving access to rooms and facilities, adapting heating or lighting controls to make them easier to use. Work can also include improving access to and movement around the home to enable an individual to care for another individual living in the property e.g. a child. If it is a child (under 19) who has the disability it is not means tested.
